

To honor the achievements of the NASA crew, scientists, and engineers of Apollo 11 and those that came before them, the countries of Palau, Grenada, and Liberia have issued designs, each featuring the timeless photos taken by Astronaut Neil Armstrong himself. These issues are among the first 50th Anniverary commemoratives to be issued. As such, they present an opportunity to get started on what should turn out to be a memorable worldwide omnibus collection.

These particular stamps were designed by the Art Department of the Inter-Governmental Philatelic
